Phil Hoppman, president of Big D Metalworks, Dallas, began his term as chairman-elect of Associated Builders and Contractors (ABC) since Jan. 1, 2014. He began his career with General Electric, where he held various financial management positions from 1973 to 1978. Hoppman served as manager of corporate development with the Elcor Corporation from 1978 to 1981 and was then named chairman, chief financial officer and chief marketing officer for the Pebcor Corporation, a position he still holds. Hoppman also has been chairman of the management committee for Southwest Automated Security since 2009.
