NAICS Code 237: Heavy Construction Contractors

NAICS Code 238: Special Trade Contractors

- Shaw Environmental & Infrastructure – (more than 2 million man-hours per year). A division of The Shaw Group based in Baton Rouge, La., the company belongs to seven ABC chapters.
- The Brock Group – (more than 2 million man-hours per year). Headquartered in Houston, the Brock Group is a member of four ABC chapters.

In the CURT Workforce Development Awards, an ABC member, a partner and a chapter took three of the four honors in recognition of their recruitment, training and education of construction professionals. They include:

- The Shaw Group, a member of seven ABC chapters;
