Senate Vote Descriptions

111th Congress

ROLL CALL 13

To Table Senate Amendment 34 to S. 181 Lilly Ledbetter Fair Pay Act

ABC's Stance: Oppose

Senate amendment 34 offered by Senator Vitter (R-LA) eliminates discrimination and ensures fairness in federal procurement by forbidding union-only project labor agreements (PLAs) on federal and federally funded construction projects. This amendment protects taxpayers and ensures fair and open competition on contracts for all federal infrastructure projects.

Construction contracts subject to PLAs almost always are awarded exclusively to unionized contractors and their all union-workforces. Only 13.9 percent of all America's construction workforce belongs to a union. This means government mandated PLAs would discriminate against almost nine out of 10 construction workers.

ROLL CALL 14

S.181 Lily Ledbetter Fair Pay Act

ABC's Stance: Oppose

The Ledbetter Fair Pay Act is an extreme piece of legislation that would effectively eliminate the statute of limitations from employment discrimination claims.

The consequences are massive and would result in countless claims being filed based on alleged acts that could have occurred decades ago, well after memories have faded, documents and witnesses have disappeared and businesses that have changed hands or no longer exist.

ROLL CALL 22

Nomination of Craig Becker to the National Labor Relations Board (NLRB)

ABC's Stance: Oppose

ABC opposed Craig Becker's nomination to the National Labor Relations Board (NLRB) due to statements he made suggesting the NLRB, without Congressional approval, could and should reverse 60 years of labor law by

severely restricting an employer's participation in workplace elections and related proceedings.

Mr. Becker had served as the Associate General Counsel to both Service Employees International Union (SEIU) and the American Federation of Labor & Congress of Industrial Organizations (AFL-CIO). Both unions adamantly support the Employee Free Choice Act (EFCA) and its anti-worker card check provision. SEIU, in particular, has a reputation for using questionable tactics to force employers to recognize a union without a secret ballot election. Due to these aforementioned reasons ABC opposed his nomination.

Yeas 33 Nays 52, Not Agreed to but was recess appointed by President Obama

ROLL CALL 105

H.R. 4872 Health Care Education Reconciliation Act

ABC's Stance: Oppose

The Health Care Education and Reconciliation Act does nothing to bend down the cost curve, and instead simply enrolls more Americans in a broken and unsustainable health care system. This bill would impose \$28 billion in new taxes on employers that do not provide government approved health plans. ABC believes that this bill does not constitute an effective reform because it does not address problems within our broken health care system and it refuses to administer the system using free market principles.

Yeas 56 Nays 43, Agreed to and signed into law

ROLL CALL 173

S. Con Res. 13, FY2010 Budget Resolution Conference Report

ABC's Stance: Oppose

The 2010 Budget Resolution aims to increase taxes on small businesses and individuals and would negatively impact economic growth and job creation. ABC was concerned with the cap-and-trade emissions tax that was included in this proposal. Also, the vast majority of ABC member businesses would take the hardest hits from increases to the top individual tax rates and limits on the amounts those small business owners can take for itemized deductions.

ROLL CALL 184

S.J. Res 26 Disapproval of EPA Greenhouse Gas Rule

ABC's Stance: Support

ABC supported Senate Joint Resolution 26 proposed by Senator Lisa Murkowski. This resolution of disapproval is in response to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) plans to introduce a host of new greenhouse gas regulations under the Clean Air Act. Allowing the EPA to move forward with regulatory action on greenhouse gas emissions without first obtaining a legislative mandate from Congress is inappropriate and will impede economic recovery. The resulting permitting delays and increased energy and materials prices will hamper much-needed construction projects and contribute to unnecessary job loss.

Yeas 47 Nays 53, vote to proceed failed, bill saw no further action

ROLL CALL 231

Senate Amendment 4596 to H.R. 5297 "The Small Business Jobs Act of 2010"

ABC's Stance: Support

ABC supported Senate Amendment 4596 offered by Senator Johanns which would fully repeal Section 9006 of the "Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (referred to as the 1099 reporting mandate). The mandate forces over 40 million entities, including governments, nonprofits, and both small and large businesses, to comply with burdensome data collection and IRS information filing on all non-credit card purchases over \$600 with any vendor per tax year. The provision requires entities to institute new complex record-keeping, data collection and reporting requirements to track every purchase by vendor and payment method, dramatically increasing accounting costs and exposing businesses to costly and unjustified IRS audits.

ROLL CALL 240

S.3628 Democracy Strengthened By casting Light on Spending in Elections (DISCLOSE) Act

ABC Stance: Opposes

Included in the DISCLOSE Act are new regulatory burdens that would adversely impact

the free speech rights of businesses and trade associations throughout the country, while allowing unions to retain their influence in the process. The legislation bans certain campaign-related activity by businesses with government contracts, but it imposes no similar restrictions on labor unions that receive federal grants or negotiate collective bargaining agreements with the government. It is a direct attempt to silence the voice of businesses and trade associations in the political process.

Yeas 59 Nays 39, vote to proceed failed, bill saw no further action

ROLL CALL 249

S.3772 Paycheck Fairness Act

ABC's Stance: Oppose

The Paycheck Fairness Act would make unlimited punitive and compensatory damages available for violations of the Equal Pay Act. Appropriate remedies for intentional discrimination, including punitive and compensatory damages, are available under Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

It includes changes to the Equal Pay Act that would make it easier to file large class actions against employers and to make it more difficult for employers to justify legitimate pay disparities. It would also force the Department of Labor to return to debunked statistical models and inaccurate survey tools in an effort to enforce civil rights laws among federal contractors.

Yeas 58 Nays 41, vote to proceed failed, bill saw no further action

ROLL CALL 276

H.R. 4853 Middle Class Tax Relief Act of 2010

ABC's Stance: Support

The Middle Class Tax Relief Act of 2010 would extend all current income tax rates for the next two years providing meaningful relief in the face of major tax increases that were expected to take effect January 1, 2011. Additionally, it would maintain the capital gains tax rate at 15 percent and would temporarily provide estate tax relief of 35 percent and \$5 million exemption.

Yeas 81 Nays 19, Agreed to and signed into law

ROLL CALL 396

H.R. 3590 Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act

ABC's Stance: Oppose

The Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act and the manager's amendment included in the bill would be highly detrimental to the construction industry. The manager's amendment in this bill singles out the construction industry by altering the small business exemption so that it applies only to those firms with 5 employees or less-an extraordinary difference from the 50 employee threshold that every other American small business will enjoy.

This legislation seeks to impose health care coverage mandates that would directly result in premium increases making insurance more expensive for employers and employees. It would also impose \$28 billion in new taxes on employers that do not provide government approved health plans. These new taxes would be paid by American workers in the form of reduced wages and job loss.

Yeas 60 Nays 39, Agreed to and signed into law

H.R. 12 Paycheck Fairness Act

ABC's Stance: Oppose

The Paycheck Fairness Act would make unlimited punitive and compensatory damages available for violations of the Equal Pay Act (EPA). Appropriate remedies for intentional discrimination, including punitive and compensatory damages, are available under Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

H.R. 12 includes changes to the Equal Pay Act that would make it easier to file large class actions against employers and to make it more difficult for employers to justify legitimate pay disparities. It would also force the Department of Labor to return to debunked statistical models and inaccurate survey tools in an effort to enforce civil rights laws among federal contractors.

H.R. 11 Lilly Ledbetter Fair Pay Act

ABC's Stance: Oppose

The Lilly Ledbetter Fair Pay Act is an extreme piece of legislation that would effectively eliminate the statute of limitations from employment discrimination claims.

The consequences are massive and would result in countless claims being filed based on alleged acts that could have occurred decades ago, well after memories have faded, documents and witnesses have disappeared and businesses that have changed hands or no longer exist.

House Amendment 29 to H.R. 1262 Water Quality and Investment Act

ABC's Stance: Support

Amendment 29 offered by Connie Mack (R-FL) would eliminate discriminatory and wasteful Davis-Bacon Act prevailing wage requirements from the Water Quality and Investment Act. Inclusion of the Davis-Bacon Act prevailing wage requirements would adversely affect small business access to construction performed under the program and inflate the costs of projects funded under this piece of legislation at the expense of the taxpayer.

ABC's Stance: Oppose

Also, the vast majority of ABC member businesses would take the hardest hits from increases to the top individual tax rates and limits on the amounts those small business owners can take for itemized deductions.

The provisions in this bill will negatively impact every business and every family that uses gasoline, diesel fuel or electricity. The passage of this bill would cause a decrease in construction of domestic energy facilities and related infrastructure. This legislation also includes a massive expansion of the detrimental Davis-Bacon Act.

H.R. 3962 Affordable Health Care for America Act

ABC's Stance: Oppose

The passage of this bill would fail to provide employers and their employees with health care solutions that are practical and affordable. This legislation seeks to impose health care mandates that would force employers to provide health care, or pay a hefty fine (an 8% payroll penalty) for not being able to do so and would stifle small businesses. A mandated level of coverage would directly result in premium increases making insurance more expensive for employers and employees.

This bill also would impose a government-run public insurance plan. This robust public option will result in higher premiums and higher taxes. The effect of the government being in the market will result in less competition and less choice; causing unfair advantages that will decimate competitors in the private market for health insurance.

H.R. 3590 Patient Protection and Affordable Health Care Act

ABC's Stance: Oppose

The Patient Protection and Affordable Health Care Act and the manager's amendment included in this bill would be highly detrimental to the construction industry. The manager's amendment in this bill singles out the construction industry by altering the small business exemption so that it applies only to those firms with 5 employees or less-an extraordinary difference from the 50 employee threshold that every other American small business will enjoy.

This legislation seeks to impose health care coverage mandates that would directly result in premium increases making insurance more expensive for employers and employees. It would also, impose \$28 billion in new taxes on employers that do not provide government approved health plans. These new taxes would be paid by American workers in the form of reduced wages and job loss.

H.R. 4872 Health Care Education Reconciliation Act (2010)

ABC's Stance: Oppose

The Health Care Education and Reconciliation Act does nothing to bend down the cost curve, and instead simply enrolls more Americans in a broken and unsustainable health care system. This bill would impose \$28 billion in new taxes on employers that do not provide government approved health plans. ABC believes that this bill does not constitute as an effective reform because it does not address all problems with our broken health care system and it refuses to administer this system on free market principles.

H.R. 5175 Democracy Strengthened By casting Light on Spending in Elections (DISCLOSE) Act

ABC Stance:Opposes

Included in the DISCLOSE ACT are new regulatory burdens that would adversely impact the free speech rights of businesses and trade associations throughout the country, while allowing unions to retain their influence in the process. The legislation bans certain campaign-related activity by businesses with government contracts, but it imposes no similar restrictions on labor unions that receive federal grants or negotiate collective bargaining agreements with the government. It is a direct attempt to silence the voice of businesses and trade associations in the political process.

H.R. 4853 Middle Class Tax Relief Act of 2010

ABC's Stance Support

The Middle Class Tax Relief Act of 2010 would extend all income tax rates for the next two years providing meaningful relief in the face of major tax increases were expected to take effect in January 1, 2011. Additionally, it would maintain the capital gains tax rate at 15 percent and would temporarily provide estate tax relief of 35 percent and \$5 million exemption.
