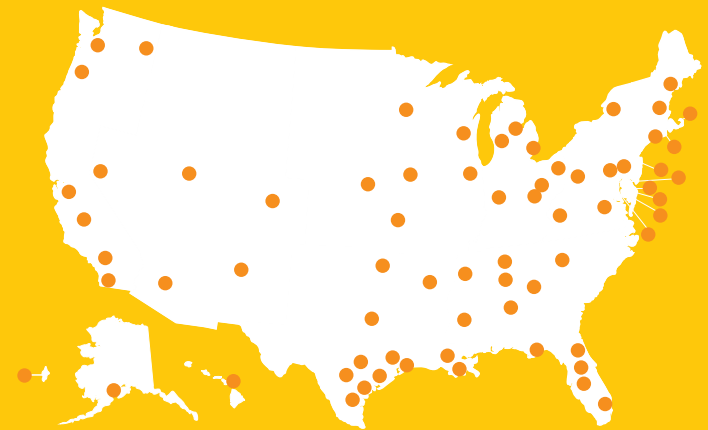

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Introduction

Every company that works in construction wants to send its workers home in the same condition in which they arrived—if not even better—after an active day of work that stimulates the mind and body. Established in 1989, STEP is a proven system that provides the framework to measure, strengthen and build industry-leading safety programs that enable top-performing ABC members to achieve incident rates nearly six times safer than the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics construction industry average.

Until now, relatively few studies have been conducted on the correlation between the use of measures companies can take to keep workers safe on jobsites—leading indicators—and the number of incidents, accidents and injuries that occur—trailing indicators. The empirical evidence did not exist.

Associated Builders and Contractors created the Safety Performance Report to address this issue.

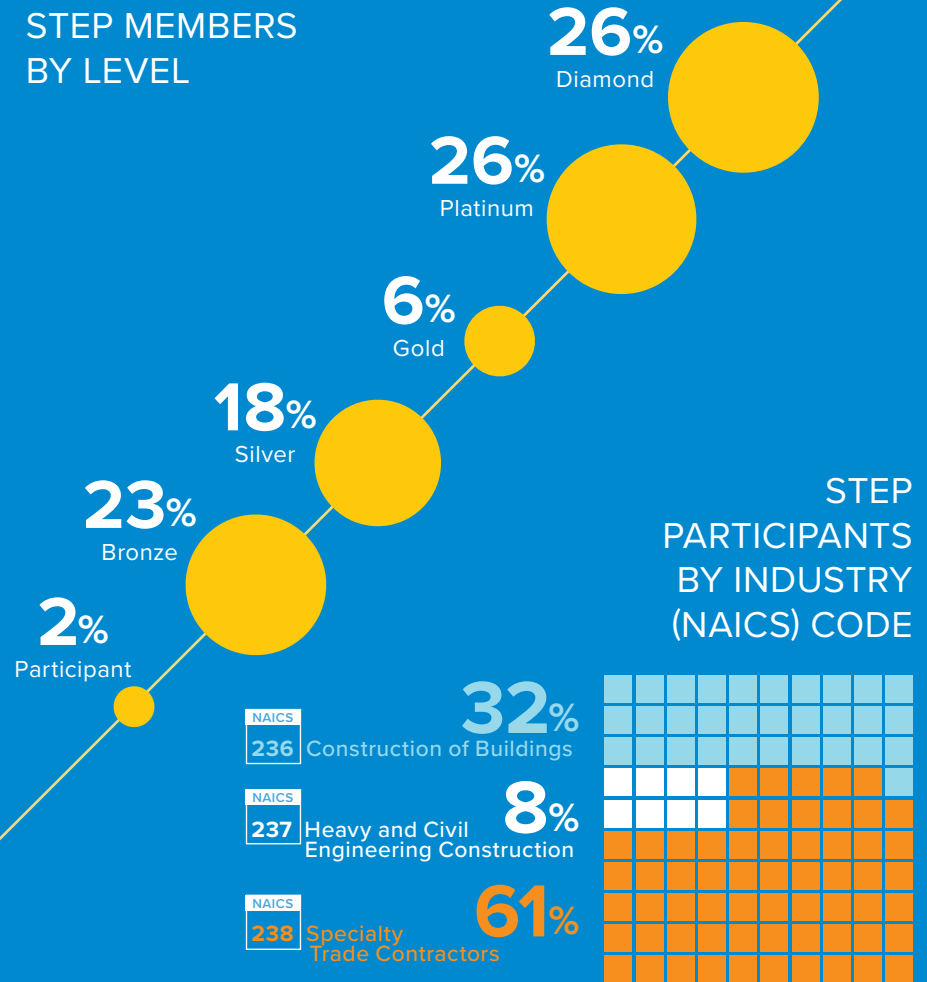
The charts and summaries within this report present the clearest picture to date of the remarkable impact that leading indicator use has on a company’s safety performance: fewer disrupted or lost lives and a safer jobsite regardless of company size. In fact, companies that engage in leading indicator use are, statistically, considerably safer than their peers.

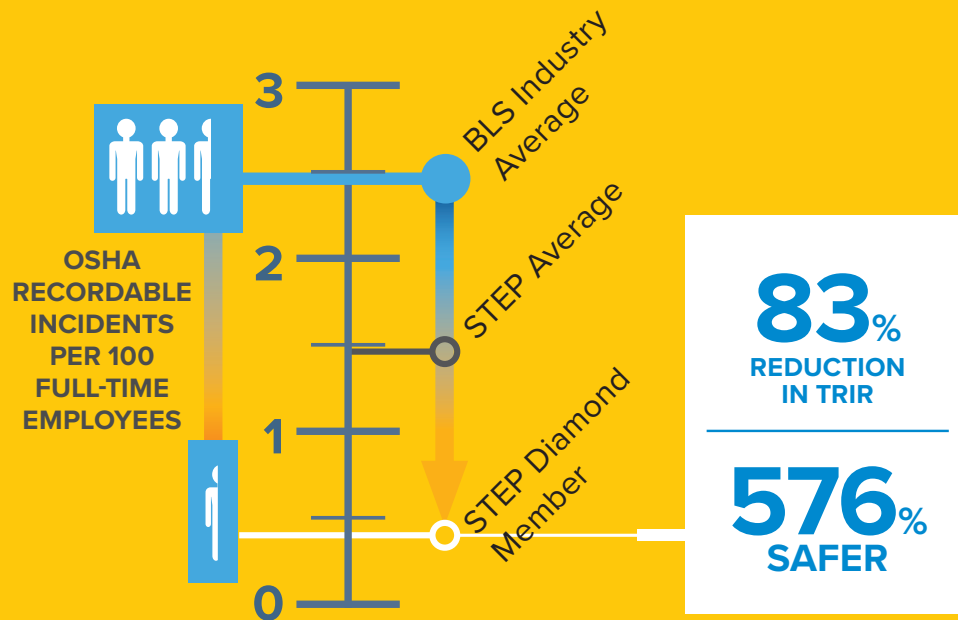
Methodology

The 2024 ABC Safety Performance Report is based on submissions of unique company data gathered from members that deployed STEP in 2023. ABC collects each company's trailing indicator data as reported on its annual Occupational Safety and Health Administration Form 300A ("Summary of Work-Related Injuries and Illnesses") and its STEP self-assessment of leading indicator practices. Each of the data points collected is sorted using statistically valid methodology developed by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics for its annual Occupational Injuries and Illnesses Survey and then combined to produce analyses of STEP member performance against BLS industry average incident rates.

The 2024 ABC Safety Performance Report is not a research project or an academic study. Since 2018, it has captured the results of ABC STEP member companies performing real work on real projects. ABC is building on the analysis of more than 900 million hours of work in 2023 to identify what comprises an industry-leading safety program.

TRAILING INDICATORS: OUTPUTS AND RESULTS

Measuring Safety Performance

The construction industry has long evaluated safety performance based on trailing indicators—statistics that measure performance based on past incidents or conditions. These statistics judge companies not on the steps taken to prevent jobsite injuries and fatalities, but rather on the number of past safety failures. Trailing indicators only tell part of the story.

Safety performance isn't reflected in what you **did**. It's reflected in what you're **doing**.

GOAL: Determine the correlation between **leading** indicator implementation and **trailing** indicator performance.

What's Behind Industry-Leading Safety Performance?

Innovative thinking from contractors, the owner/user community and insurers puts leading indicators under the microscope.

ABC has studied how to improve safety through STEP since 1989.

The 2023 STEP self-assessment is comprised of key components—leading indicators that are proven to improve safety performance and the criteria that indicate best practices. Members that deploy STEP score their level of achievement for each component on a weighted scale of 0 points (low score) up to 12 points (high score). Companies receive a recognition level of Diamond, Platinum, Gold, Silver, Bronze or Participant based on their score.

ABC quantified the positive impact of proactive injury and hazard elimination tools on the jobsite using data gathered from STEP participants in construction, heavy construction, civil engineering and specialty trades. Analyzing aggregated data allows ABC to determine how measures taken to prevent incidents actually improve trailing indicator performance.

STEP Improves Safety



STEP is a safety management system. Participating ABC member firms measured their safety processes and policies on key components in 2023 through a detailed self-assessment with the goal of implementing or enhancing safety programs that reduce jobsite incident rates. Applying industry-leading processes dramatically improves safety performance among participants, regardless of company size or type of work.

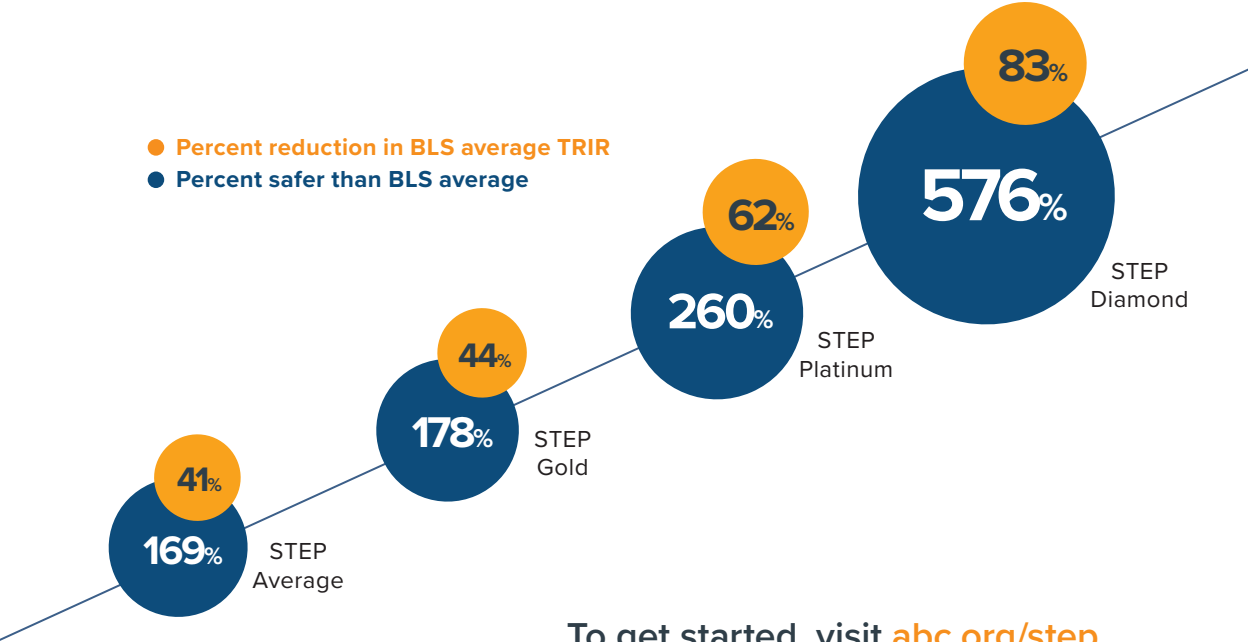

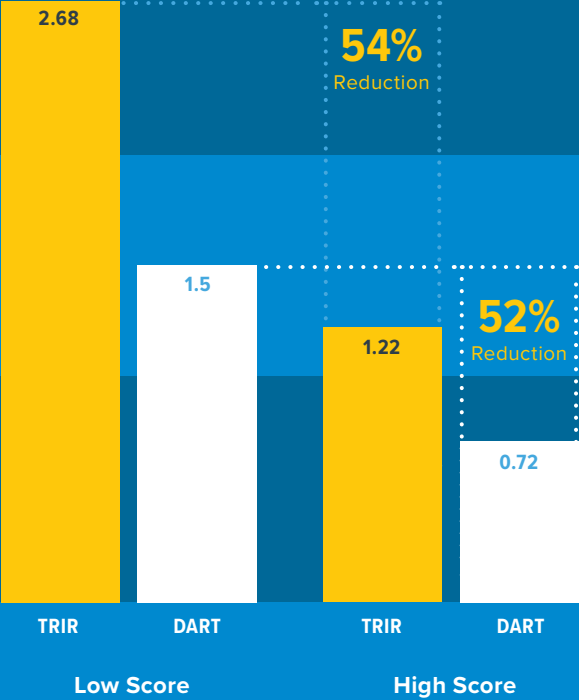

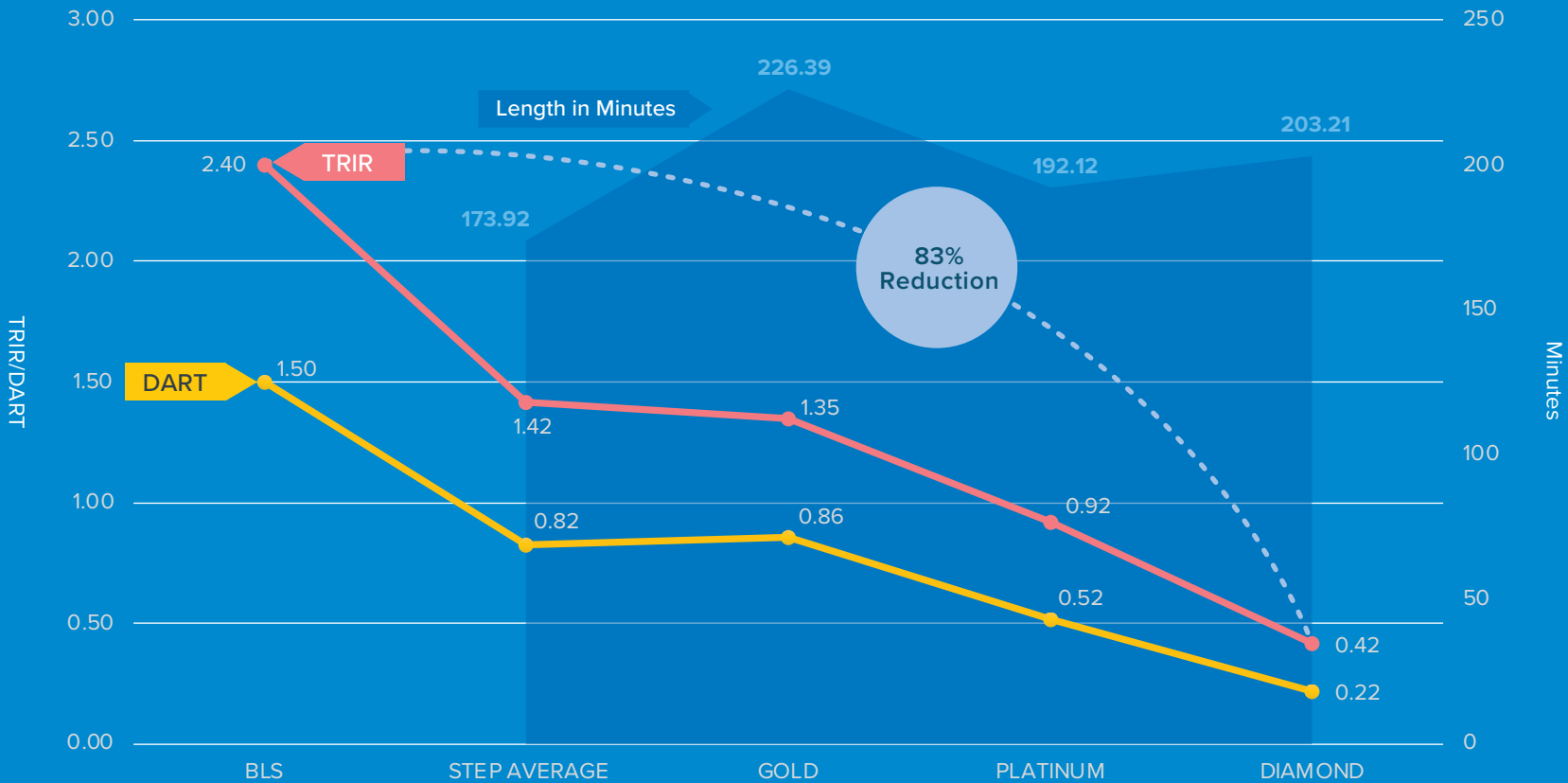
Top Management Engagement Matters

Employer involvement at the highest level of company management produces a 54% reduction in TRIR and a 52% reduction in DART rates. In high-scoring ABC STEP member firms, the owner/CEO:

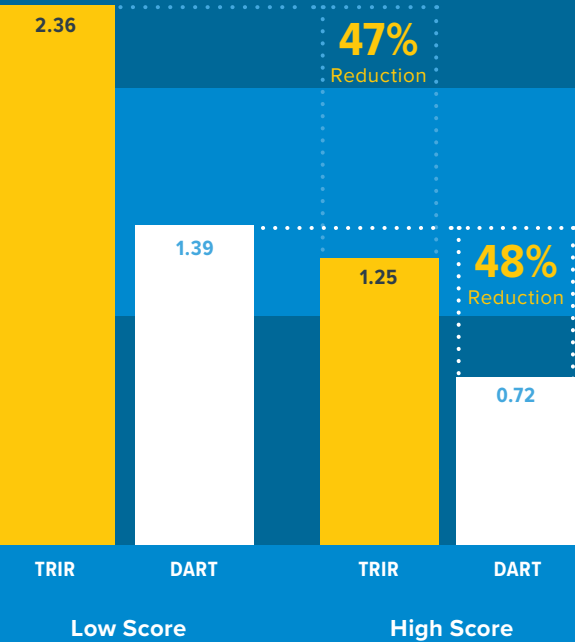
- Is a direct and active participant in the safety program
- Instills personal accountability for safety throughout the company
- Tracks and annually reviews safety goals and objectives
- Solicits feedback on the safety program and seeks ways to improve it
- Commits resources—money, time, personnel, equipment, supplies, etc.
- Integrates safety into performance appraisals and other company operations

IN-DEPTH SAFETY ORIENTATIONS ARE MORE EFFECTIVE

STEP Diamond members invested an average of 203 minutes in safety orientations in 2023. STEP Diamond companies that conduct new hire orientation sessions of more than three hours on average improve their TRIR by 83%.

Substance Abuse
Prevention Programs


One-third of all incidents on construction jobsites are drug- or alcohol-related. Robust substance abuse prevention programs/ policies with provisions for drug and alcohol testing where permitted lead to a 47% reduction in TRIR and a 48% reduction in DART rates. Plus, substance abuse testing can be an effective method of incident prevention if used properly.




ABC is an active member of the Construction Coalition for a Drug- and Alcohol-Free Workplace. Signing the pledge is a STEP requirement. Take the pledge at drugfreeconstruction.org.

SUBSTANCE ABUSE PREVENTION PROGRAMS REDUCE INCIDENTS


Key components include:



A safety policy with strict rules regarding drug and alcohol use, supervisor training, recordkeeping and active enforcement

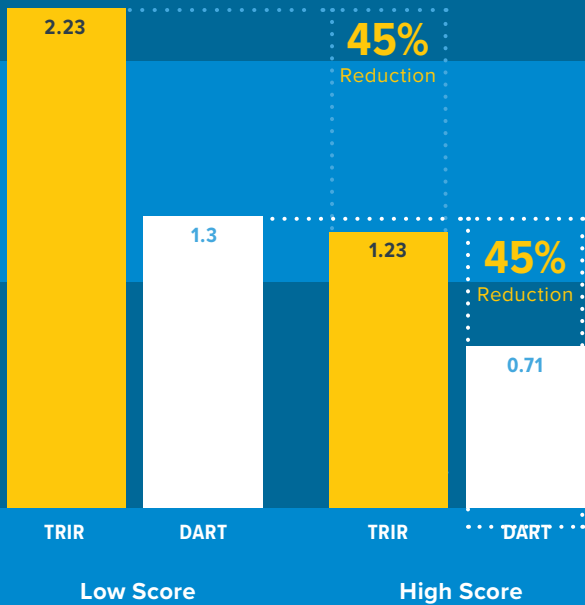


Drug and alcohol testing pre-hire, randomly and with reasonable suspicion



An employee assistance program and available education on substance abuse prevention

NEW HIRE SAFETY ORIENTATION: LOW SCORE VS. HIGH SCORE



BEST PRACTICES

New Hire Safety Orientation

Companies that conduct an in-depth indoctrination of new employees into the safety culture, systems and processes based on a documented orientation process experience incident rates that are 45% lower than companies that limit their orientations to basic safety and health compliance topics. The CEO or senior leadership delivers that introduction to the company’s safety culture and core values, including:

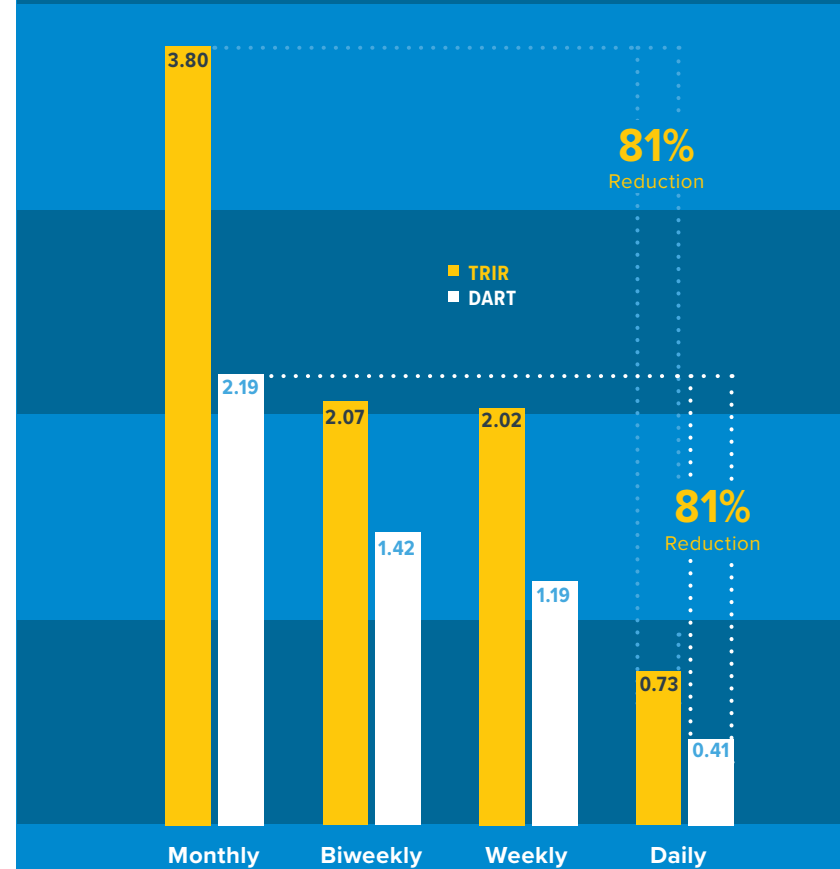
- Safety commitment, expectations and responsibilities
- Workplace safety rules specific to the site and hazards
- Hazard, injury and emergency communication and reporting procedures
- Protective gear/safety skills demonstrations
- Assignment of a safety mentor to each new hire until orientation is complete
- Performance evaluation and recordkeeping

BEST PRACTICES

Frequency of Toolbox Talks

Can you brief employees on safety too much? No matter what you may have heard, there is no negative effect to conducting daily toolbox talks—brief, single-topic training sessions of 15 to 30 minutes held on the jobsite for all employees. The less frequently this type of training is conducted and the fewer safety topics covered, the higher the trailing indicators. Companies that conduct daily toolbox talks reduce TRIR and DART rates by 81% compared to companies that hold them monthly.

A leading indicator is a system or process used to identify hazards and eliminate or minimize the condition to prevent injury.

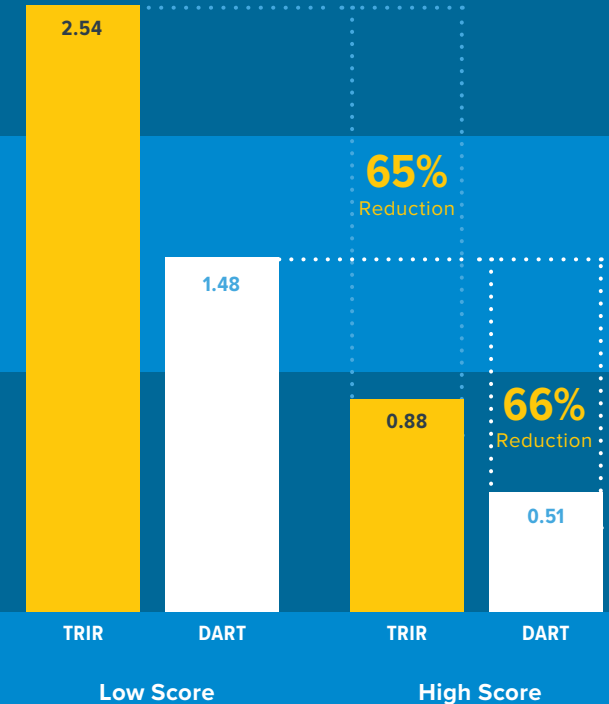

Leading Indicators

Tracking and reviewing activities carried out to prevent and control injury, such as safety training, new hire safety orientation and behavior-based safety observations, leads to a 65% reduction in TRIR and a 66% reduction in DART rates.



LEADING INDICATORS: LOW SCORE VS. HIGH SCORE





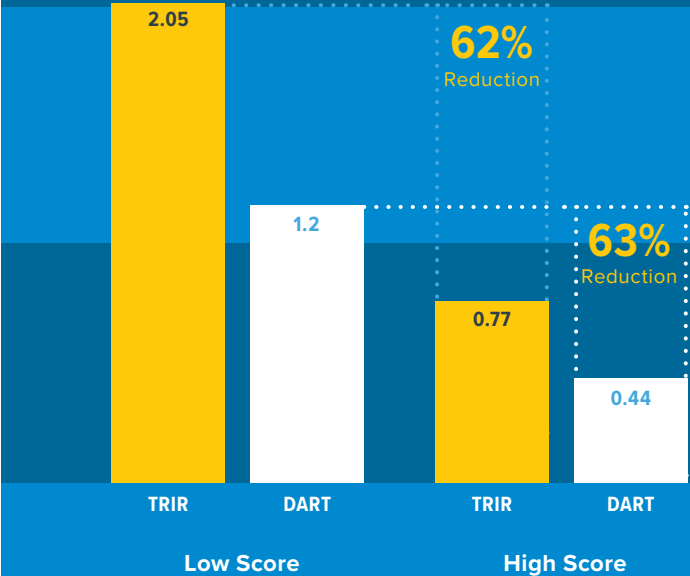

Behavior-Based Safety

A process that informs management and employees of the overall safety culture in the workplace through safety observations improves TRIR and DART by 62% and 63%, respectively.

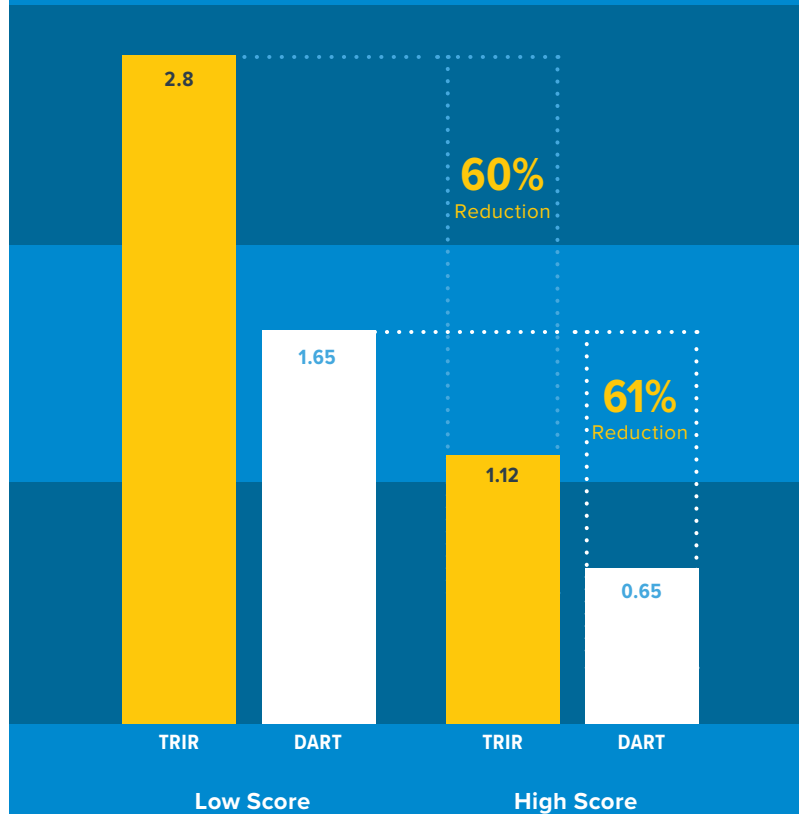

Pre-Planning for Project Safety

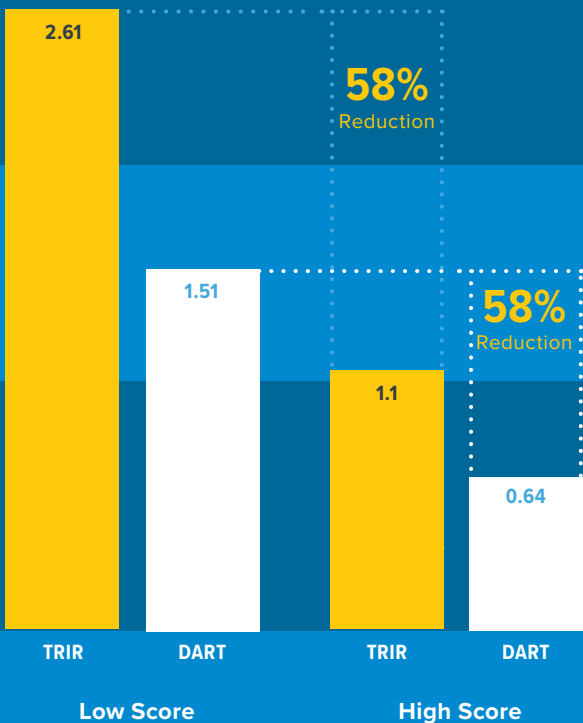
Educating project supervisors and other key personnel in pre-planning for project safety reduces TRIR rates by 60% and DART rates by 61%.

CORE LEADING INDICATORS

Supervisor Safety Training

Ensuring all supervisory personnel have an in-depth, well-versed understanding of the company's safety policy, supervisor safety expectations and other specific competencies that reduce TRIR and DART by 58%. Training topics include:

First aid, CPR, AED, the OSHA 30 safety course and emergency response procedures, as well as annual refresher training

Ensuring worker competency in trade- and task-specific topics, jobsite safety or incident investigation and job safety analysis

Providing professional development opportunities, a safety subject matter expert and dedicated training facilities with competent and qualified trainers



CORE LEADING INDICATORS

Task-Specific Safety Process

Establishing a process to define the scope of work, analyze hazards, develop and implement hazard control methods, perform the work within established controls as well as provide feedback and continuous improvement leads to a 57% reduction in TRIR and a 59% reduction in DART rates.

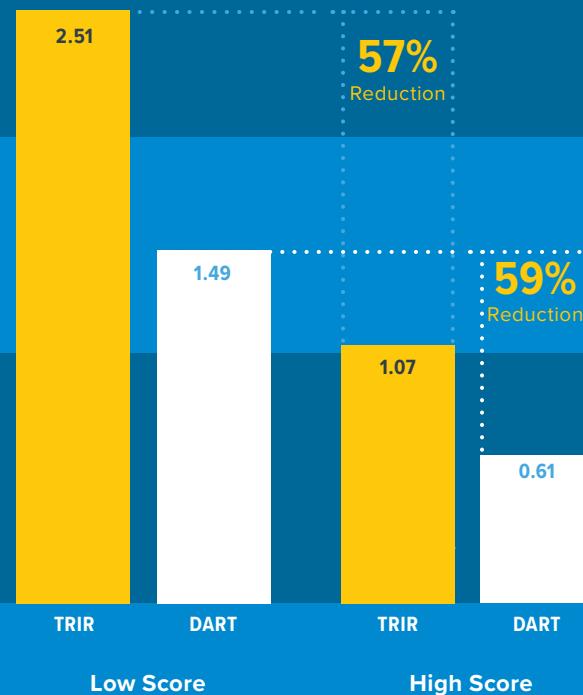
The process is consistently used and reviewed annually by top managers and safety staff

All personnel are trained in using the process and confirm their understanding of work hazards and mitigation processes

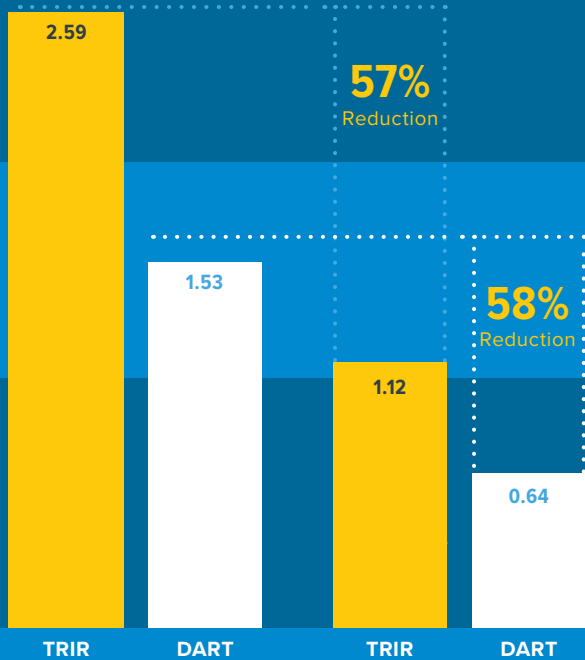
Each task is reviewed separately, and outcomes are explained to employees

A change in conditions requires work to be stopped, and the process is reviewed and altered to complete the work safely

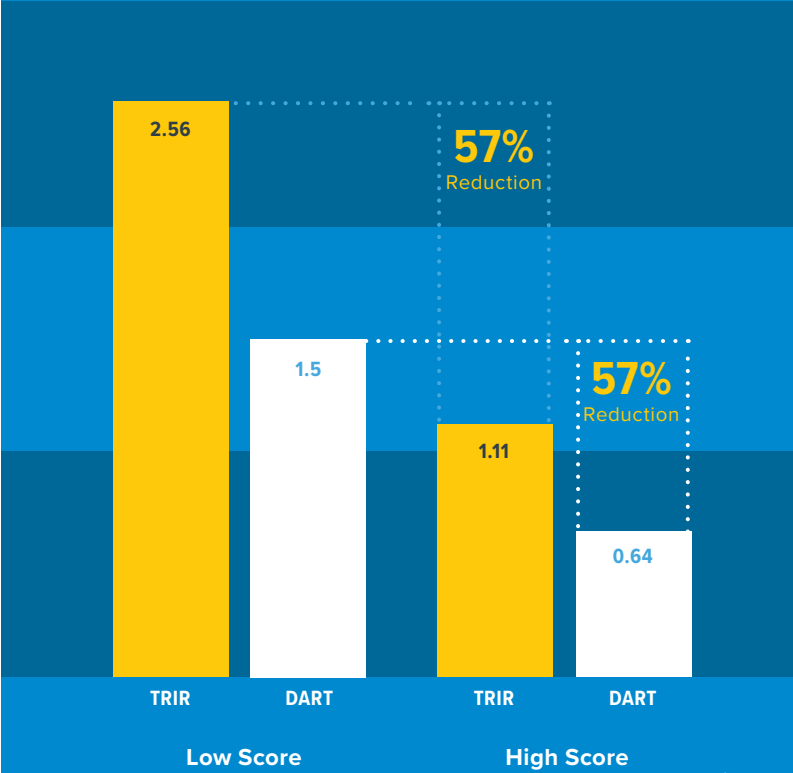
Safety Program Performance Review

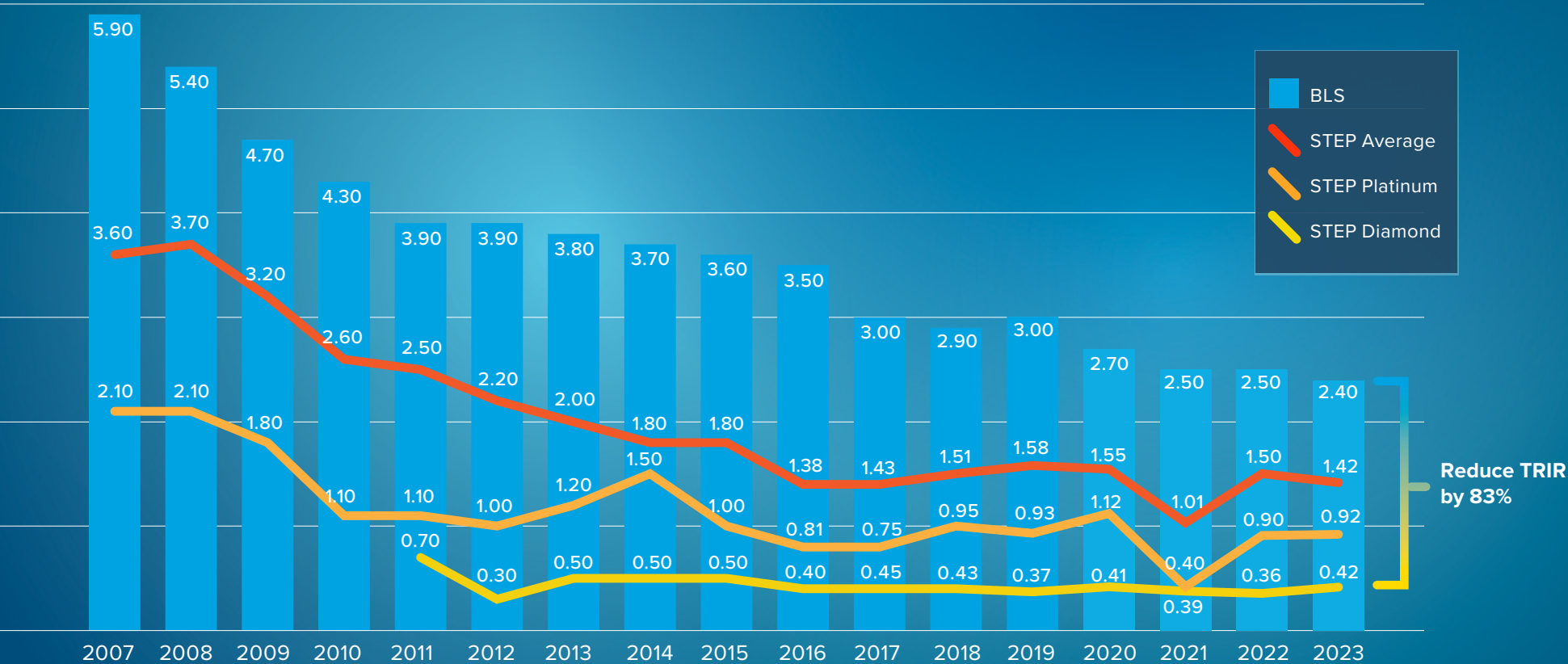

Glossary of Common Terms

ABC – Associated Builders and Contractors, a construction trade association representing more than 23,000 merit shop contractors and affiliated firms nationwide.

Accredited Quality Contractor – ABC’s credential recognizing members’ commitment to corporate responsibility in quality, safety, talent management—including inclusion, diversity and merit—education and community relations.

Behavior-Based Safety – A formal process to document observations of daily safety behaviors of the workforce. It is designed to get everyone involved in speaking up and correcting potentially unsafe behaviors and conditions. The data is collected, analyzed and corrective action is taken.

BLS – U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, a federal agency responsible for providing statistical analysis on workplace injuries, illnesses and fatalities. Operates under the scope of the U.S. Department of Labor.

CCDAFW – Construction Coalition for a Drug- and Alcohol-Free Workplace, established in 2012 by construction trade associations to develop resources in the campaign to eliminate substance abuse in the industry.

DART – Days Away, Restricted or Transferred rate. Measures the number of cases per 100 full-time employees where an injury or illness causes an employee to be restricted or transferred based on inability to perform normal job functions.

Disrupted Life/Lives – Nonstatistical term used to describe the impact on the employee, friends and family when a life has been disrupted because of an injury suffered during work hours.

EMR – The Experience Modification Rate or “mod factor.” Calculation normally performed by the insurance industry (National Council on Compensation Insurance or state-level agency) reflecting percentage of workers’ compensation payouts by a company compared to a company of similar size and type.

FTE – Full-time employee as defined by BLS and captured on a company’s OSHA Form 300A, which tracks the number of full-time employees that a company employs in the course of a calendar year.

Good Catch – The recognition and correction of a hazardous condition or event that, if it occurred, would likely not cause death, serious physical harm or extensive property damage.

Leading Indicators – A measure preceding or indicating a future event that is used to drive and measure activities carried out to prevent and control injury, such as safety training, new hire safety orientation and behavior-based safety observations.

Lost Life/Lives – Nonstatistical term used to describe a fatality caused by an injury suffered during work hours and the long-term impact, beyond the lost life, on family and friends.

New Hire Safety Orientation – Amount of time, in minutes, that a company devotes to covering safety-related topics during orientation for all new employees.

OSHA – The Occupational Safety and Health Administration, a U.S. government agency tasked with establishing workplace safety and health requirements and enforcement of existing rules. Operates under the scope of the U.S. Department of Labor.

OSHA Form 300A – The “Summary of Work-Related Injuries and Illnesses” required by OSHA for all companies with 11 or more employees. It is created using information gathered from a company’s OSHA Form 300, the “Log of Work-Related Injuries and Illnesses.”

Potential Significant Event – The recognition and correction of a hazardous condition or event that, if it occurred, would likely cause death, serious physical harm or extensive property damage.

Pre-Planning for Jobsite Safety – Evaluating safety, quality and efficiency processes to eliminate hazards and accident potential during the identification of potential projects. Continuing that process in the estimating, pre-bid planning, bidding, sourcing, permitting, staging, jobsite evaluations, jobsite management planning, job-specific training and repeating the process for any work order changes or job scope/plan revisions.

Resources for Safety – Funds, time, personnel, equipment, supplies, etc., are regularly budgeted and invested, and the return on safety investment (actual or projected) is tracked to evaluate the effectiveness of resource allocation and to guide future expenditure decisions.

Safety Inspections – A formal process to visually analyze and document jobsite conditions and worker behavior in relation to safety. Generally these are performed utilizing a checklist so the good conditions and behaviors are documented as well as the ones that need to be corrected. Deficiencies that need to be corrected are assigned if they cannot be corrected immediately. Corrective action is documented.

Safety Program Performance Review – Key safety leaders monitor performance and progress, verify the program is implemented and operating as designed, correct program shortcomings and identify opportunities to improve.

STEP – ABC’s safety management system, created in 1989 to gather data related to member safety performance and to evaluate the effectiveness of safety programs based on the key components of industry-leading safety programs.

Substance Abuse Prevention Programs – Programs designed to reduce incidents that include strict rules regarding drug and alcohol use, supervisor training, recordkeeping and active enforcement. Robust substance abuse prevention programs have an employee assistance program, education on substance abuse prevention and may include drug and alcohol testing.

Supervisor Safety Training – Supervisory personnel receive safety training including, but not limited to the company safety policy, the employer’s supervisor safety expectations, first aid/CPR/AED, OSHA 30-competent person for trade/task-specific topics, emergency response procedures, completing an incident investigation, conducting a jobsite safety inspection, creating a job safety analysis, key points in leadership and human resources and conducting effective

meetings. Opportunities for professional development are offered and supervisors participate in annual refresher safety training.

Task-Specific Safety Process – A formal method to analyze the work to be done, assess hazards that may be encountered and identify controls to eliminate the hazards completely or at least keep them away from workers. These include job hazard analysis, activity hazard analysis, pre-task planning, safety task analysis and others. This process involves establishing a work group that encourages employees to voice concerns and corrective actions to prevent an incident.

Toolbox Talks – Topic-specific, short-format training, usually conducted before the workday or during lunch breaks, aimed at crews and site employees to educate on specific safety and health topics, hazards, policies and procedures.

Top Management Engagement – The owner/ CEO is a direct and active participant in the safety program, instilling personal accountability for safety throughout the company. This leader tracks and reviews safety goals, solicits feedback and seeks ways to improve the safety program, commits necessary resources and integrates safety into performance appraisals.

Top Performers – ABC’s annual ranking of contractor members that build long-lasting, high-quality construction projects, based on work hours. Visit abc.org/topperformers to learn more.

Trailing Indicators – Metrics used to measure safety performance based on historical data (e.g., incident rate, DART, etc.).

TRIR – Total Recordable Incident Rate. Measures the number of cases per 100 full-time employees where an injury or illness caused a loss of life or a situation resulting in an employee being unable to work (days away), restricted or transferred based on inability to perform normal job functions, or any other injury that falls under OSHA’s definition of a recordable incident.

ABC added **total human health** as a key component of an effective safety program. Total human health raises the bar for keeping workers safe to acknowledge and address thoughts and preoccupying concerns that everyone experiences in daily life, incorporating:

- **A whole-person approach** to engage a person’s body, mind, heart and soul.
- **Psychological safety** that is respectful and inclusive of a diverse workforce.
- **Acknowledgement of the risk of distraction and impairment** and responding with appropriate care.

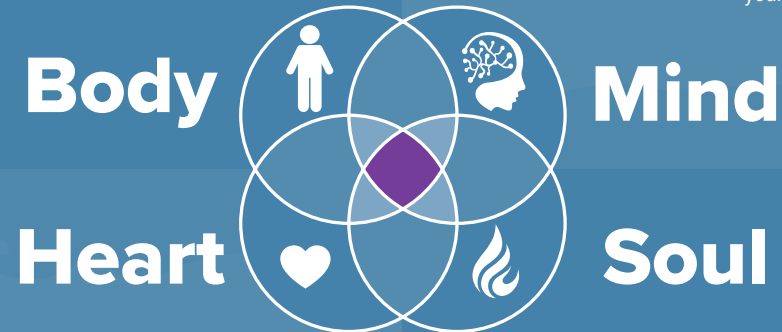
