Dear Majority Leader Reid, Republican Leader McConnell, Speaker Boehner, and Leader Pelosi:

As members of the Family Business Estate Tax Coalition (FBETC), we are asking you to pass legislation addressing the estate tax before the end of the year. Action is urgently needed to prevent the estate tax from saddling thousands more family-owned businesses and farms with a crippling tax increase.

The goal of the FBETC has always been full repeal of the estate tax, and we still believe this is the best solution to protect all family-owned businesses from the estate tax. At a minimum, the FBETC supports maintaining current estate tax policy, with an exemption level of \$5 million and the maximum rate of 35 percent.

It is also imperative that the exemption is indexed to inflation, provides for spousal transfer and includes stepped-up basis. Estate tax reform that includes these important components is critical for family-owned businesses and farms that are struggling to create much needed jobs and expand their operations.

At the end of 2010, 277 Representatives and 81 Senators, Republicans and Democrats alike, compromised to set the estate tax at its current level. Members of the FBETC strongly oppose efforts which would retreat from the bipartisan agreement.

If Congress fails to pass legislation extending this current policy, the Joint Committee on Taxation estimates that 13 times more families, 20 times more farms, and 9 times more small businesses will be forced to pay the estate tax. Such an outcome would have a devastating impact on family-owned businesses and farms. One study concluded that as many as 1.2 million jobs would be lost.

Between 2002 and 2012, the exemption level and tax rate for the estate tax have changed nine times. The uncertainty of the current law has left many family-owned businesses and farms

guessing about their estate tax liabilities and unable to make prudent business decisions. The significant costs to plan for the estate tax reduce investment in business growth and job creation, which is only made worse by the current uncertainty surrounding the tax. Ultimately, a permanent solution is needed because without it, there are no assurances that future generations will be capable of sustaining these family-owned businesses and farms.

As Congress considers proposals to address the fiscal cliff and the impending tax increases scheduled for January 1, 2013, we urge you to support estate tax relief to ensure the survival of thousands of family-owned businesses and farms. We look forward to working with you to address this critical issue as soon as possible.
