Paul H. Lemley, senior vice President of Triangle Associates, Grand Rapids, Mich., began his term as Mid-America region vice chair of Associated Builders and Contractors Jan. 1, 2016. The Mid-America region includes members and chapters in Indiana, Michigan and Ohio.

As a member of the ABC Executive Committee, Lemley helps oversee the activities of the national association, sets policy and assists the national chairman in carrying out the mandates of the ABC Board of Directors.

Previously, Lemley served on several committees with the ABC Western Michigan Chapter, as a member of the chapter's board of directors since 2010, as a member of the executive committee in 2012 and as board chair in 2014. He also helped the chapter create a career exploration event that exposed 6,000 middle and high school students to careers in construction, health care, manufacturing and information technology.

In his position with Triangle, Lemley is responsible for the growth of national accounts in the education, industrial, retail and medical markets. With an extensive background in those business sectors, he specializes in design/build project delivery and has responsibilities in both business development and operations.

Prior to joining Triangle, Lemley was president and chief operating officer of Bouma Corporation, and senior vice president and general manager for Alberici Constructors where he was responsible for the global automotive business unit and the Great Lakes region. Both of these organizations have strong self-performing specialty trades organizations, which Lemley oversaw. Previous to Alberici, he was a senior executive with a large A/E firm, executing both

the design and construction of complex manufacturing, laboratory and commercial projects globally. He started his career at National Steel Corporation as part of the team executing a \$2.6 billion capital improvements program. Paul has 25 years of experience as a manager in the construction industry; over 15 of those years spent in senior management positions executing projects in the Americas, Europe and Asia.

Active in professional and community organizations, Lemley also was appointed by Gov. Rick Snyder to the Michigan Electrical Administrative Board (2013 – 2017), is a past president of the Boy Scouts of America – Clinton Valley Council, and is a former board member of the Michigan Minority Business Development Council, and founder of the Clays for Kids Foundation helping underserved children.

Lemley earned his Associate of Science degree in electrical engineering technology and his Bachelor of Science degree from Lawrence Technological University.
